FACILITATOR NOTES

Dear Facilitator,

Welcome to the Ask Me Anything video and scheme of work!

We have created 4 sessions:

- 1. Introduction to Ask Me Anything
- 2. Watch the show
- 3. Post show discussions
- 4. Practical workshop

There are no timings used within the sessions, this is so that each facilitator can run the sessions in the way that is most useful to them. Where there is a practical task or activity given, we say within the instructions: 'your facilitator will let you know how long you have to do this task', and you can decide on the time frame.

For this reason, you may find that you want to rework our 4-session format and spend more or less time on each session. For example, if participants are new to The Paper Birds, you may want to split session 1 across 2 of your own lessons with your group. Please do what makes sense to you and your group.

What we are advising, is that you do make ample time for discussion, support and safeguarding. The show deals with some very sensitive issues and whilst we have a suitability rating of 13+ and have included trigger warnings, please exercise your own judgement around the suitability for individuals within your group.

Page 7-9 Dear Young People This is the original letter that the company sent to the groups of young people from 3 schools and 3 youth theatres across the UK. It was in this letter that we explain the idea for our show and ask the young people to write back to us with a question or a worry.

Our research

As we were going to be 'agony aunts' within the show, one of the pieces of research that we undertook was to find out more about the history of agony aunts.

We were particularly interested in why they have seemed to die out since our teenage years. Link to 'Sex, Lies & Love Bites, the Agony Aunt Story' a BBC documentary on agony aunts.

Here we share a list of some of the issues raised within the letters. This list is also to act as a trigger warning so that participants understand the type of issues that will be raised before they see the show and have time to approach their facilitator if they are feeling uncomfortable.

Page 15

Creative writing task

Here we ask participants to see young people though the eyes of a character from a different generation. An internal monologue, the participants can explore the stereotypes, misunderstandings, of the way the young generation is seen but others, but also, they can explore the stereotypes and misunderstandings of another generation, that of their characters.

Please note: Participants need to be given a time frame for completing this piece of work.

Session 2: Watch *Ask Me Anything"

Questions asked include:

- To Jemma Mc Donnell- Director. Why did you choose to make a show about this subject?
- To Georgie Coles- Performer. How did you pick which letters to respond to?
- To Rebecca Wood- **Set & costume designer**. How were the costumes used to help create the style of the production? Were the costumes successful at communicating the style of the production?
- To Kylie Perry- Performer. Can you describe the style of acting used in Ask Me Anything and what do you do as performers to communicate that style to the audience?

Page 1

Title slide: 'Session 4, Workshop'.

Page 2

Exercise 1- Scripting Siri

A short video (3mins, 4 secs) by Kylie Perry who introduces the workshop. Within this video Kylie then shares a clip of the AI character in Ask Me Anything 'Bridge It' (she shows 8.05 - 8.43 within the show) and gives task for participants to write a script between a character and an AI.

Written recap of the bullet points of Scripting Siri:

- Consider all the functions that an AI has- to play music, tell you the time, weather, what is the character doing/ asking/ needing help with?
- Think about the relationship between the two- is the AI purely fictional or does it have a personality?
- You are now going to script a conversation between the two.

Please note: Participants need to be given a time frame for completing this piece of work.

Page 4 Exercise 2- Staging Sitcom

A short video (5 mins) by Kylie Perry who introduces the second exercise. Within this video Kylie shares a clip of the sitcom within the show 'Teenage Kicks' (she shows 22.36-25.02 within the show) and gives task for participants to turn a real life memory from their childhood into a sitcom scene that they can film.

Session 4: Workshop

Page 5

Written recap of the bullet points of **Staging Sitcom**:

- Start by writing a memory of something trivial or embarrassing that happened to you
 when you were younger; for example, not winning a competition or having an
 argument with a friend, or falling over in front of a person you fancy.
- You are now going to turn this event into a sitcom scene. Think about how to talk to the camera, to explain or re-live the situation. Try to use set and props, camera angles to enhance the drama.
- Perform and film your scene.

Please note: Participants need to be given a time frame for completing this piece of work.

Exercise 3- Writing advice

A short video (3 mins, 40 secs) by Kylie Perry who introduces the last exercise. Within this video Kylie shares a clip of the issues raised within the show (she shows 1 hour 4 mins- 1 hour 6 mins within the show) and gives task for participants to write a letter replying to the young people.

Written recap of the bullet points of Writing Advice:

- You are now going to write a letter to reply to the young people who wrote to us.
 You may have one person or letter in mind that you really connected with, or you can write to the young people collectively.
- What do you want to say? What advice would you give?
